Bursary Details

Relocation bursaries are available for Australian citizens commencing the Bachelor of Regional and Town Planning program in Semester 1, 2019 who are relocating to Brisbane from Australian locations outside the South East Queensland region.

This document sets out the terms and conditions, which apply to these bursaries.

Terms and Conditions

How to apply:

- Lodge an official application through the Queensland Tertiary Admissions Center (QTAC) for entry into the UQ Bachelor of Regional and Town Planning to commence in Semester 1, 2019.
- 2. Receive a QTAC Application Number
- 3. Complete and submit the **Relocation Bursary Application Form** (www.science.uq.edu.au/regional-town-planning-relocation-bursaries)

UQ must receive your application by the bursary closing date, 4 February 2019.



UQ will not consider incomplete applications or applications that are found to be inaccurate, false or misleading.

Eligibility:

The applicants must:

- be an Australian citizen;
- have a home address outside the South East Queensland (SEQ) region defined as any area not contained in the area included in the map which appears in Appendix 1;
- be commencing the Bachelor of Regional and Town Planning (BRTP) program at UQ in 2019;
- enrol full time in 2019 in the BRTP program and its first year courses;

Selection Process:

Applications will be considered weekly until the closing date.

- The Head of School of Earth and Environmental Sciences, or nominee, will select bursary recipients.
- Selection will be based on candidates' home address and the requirement to relocate to Brisbane to undertake study in the Bachelor of Regional and Town Planning.
- Wherever possible, UQ will notify applicants of the outcome of their application within one week of the submission of their application
- The decision of the Head of School is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

Obligations of bursary recipients:

Each bursary winner must:

- Commence study in the Bachelor of Regional and Town Planning in Semester 1, 2019.
- Remain enrolled and in good standing by the University's academic census date, 31 March, 2019.
- Conform to University regulations (including disciplinary provisions).

Payment:


- Payment of bursaries is conditional on bursary recipients meeting the obligations outlined above, as applicable, at the payment date.
- UQ will pay the bursary recipients after the academic census date in the Semester 1, 2019.
- UQ will pay into each recipient's nominated Australian bank account.

Communication/Publicity:

- In some cases, UQ will ask bursary winners to provide testimonials and agree for their images and personal profiles to be distributed via printed and electronic means to prospective students, media and education agents to acknowledge their success.
- In some cases, UQ may ask bursary winners to speak about their UQ experiences to prospective students.
